


MARAZION SCHOOL NEWSLETTER 6th June 2024

Marazion School Classes 2024-25

In/Out of School

Year 6 Transition: Tectonics are meeting staff from their chosen secondary school (MBA or HDS) in school over the next 2 weeks. KS2 Funky Forest Friday: During summer 2, for children in KS2, Forest Friday is getting Funky! Our Year 6 mechanics are working with Mr Case on Friday afternoons. Other children are working in vertical groups from Year 3 to Year 6, taking part in a range of activities linked to nature, including body percussion with sounds in nature; printing with natural materials; looking at what we can grow or buy locally; connecting with nature through mindfulness. Children also have the opportunity to take part in intra-school tournaments, competing in groups in a range of tournaments led by Mr Tanner. This week it's rounders.
