2025 Residential Visits

Year 3 Residential Visit: Year 3 children are off to Porthpean during the first week back after Easter from Wednesday 23rd to Friday 25th April. The total cost of this visit is £175. Full payment for this residential needs to be paid by TOMORROW, Friday 28th March. At the moment we cannot accept bank payments so this can only be paid by cash to the school office (see above). A reminder that a pupil premium subsidy is available for this visit. Please speak to Tamsyn or Ed in the School Office for more information about the subsidy. Year 4/5 Residential Visit: Please note change of dates. Children in Year 4 and 5 are now off to Camp Kernow from Wednesday 18th to Friday 20th June. A Parents' Meeting for this residential visit is in school on Tuesday 29th April (straight after school).

We have again been able to offer a subsidy on the cost of 2025 residential visits for all children - school fundraising money is used to subsidise these visits.
