#### In/Out of School

School Visits: Notting Hill's Topic Outcome is on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> November. Children are going to Red River for 10am to sail their incredible boats and crafting sand sculptures and doing a beach clean after that. Children need to come to school wearing their own home clothes with lots of layers along with a waterproof coat. Please can children wear wellies if they have them - please note that we have some spare wellies in school. Children are back in school for a later lunch. Stonewall class are going to Plymouth on a faith visit on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> November. They are guests in both the Plymouth Synagogue and Mosque where they are learning about links across religions and what faith means to followers. The cost of the visit is £5 per child. Please can children wear school uniform as usual and bring a packed lunch and refillable water bottle with them for the day. We aim to leave school by 8am and return by 5pm. Please can children be dropped to school at the earlier time of 7:45am. Marazion School Reading Room (RR): Children can choose to come into school and read for pleasure from 8.30-8.45am every day. If you did not manage to read the night before then you can use this time to catch up; if you need to read desperately as your book is so exciting or it's a cold day and you want to warm up with a book...head to the RR first thing. Invictus are hosting the sessions next week. Forest Fridays: Children in Reception and KS1 have Beach School / Woodland School in the morning and KS2 children have Forest Friday in the afternoon. A reminder that adults and children wear comfortable clothes that they do not mind getting dirty on Fridays. These clothes must also be suitable for working outside.

Swimming Sessions: Some children in Year 5 and 6 are swimming on Wednesday afternoons this half term. Pupils need swimming kit (black costume or trunks - not board shorts) and goggles (if you have them) as well as a £1 contribution towards the cost of the sessions. School provides swimming caps. Thanks. There is a LATER pick up @ 4pm for children who are swimming. Gym Sessions: Children in Invictus are having their gym sessions at Penzance Gym for this half term on Monday afternoons. Please can children come to school in their PE kit on Mondays. A reminder that all children need to wear a T Shirt that has no buttons to the gym. Thanks. Optional PE Homework: For November PE homework, we are again asking adults and children to do some Extreme Reading. The most extreme reader wins a £10 book voucher.
