#### Dear Parents,

A reminder that Marazion Clubs start from next Monday 20<sup>th</sup> January. Clubs letters have gone back out to children today. Please note that Dodgeball and KS1 Craft Club are both oversubscribed so, as usual, the clubs have 2 groups of children who attend the club for 5 weeks. Please make sure that you check which group your child is in. Thanks. Marazion clubs run after school from 3.15-4pm (except LEGO League and Rock Band) and pick up is from the main playground gate.

#### Marazion Town Annual Civic Service

The Marazion Town Annual Civic Service is this Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> January. The Mayor, Cllr John Nicholas, welcomes everyone to attend the service to celebrate and reflect on the past year in Marazion. Some Marazion School children are singing at the service. Please join us at 10.15am at Marazion Town Hall for the procession at 10.30am, this is followed by a service at All Saints Church from 10.45am.

#### No Parking on School Lane

A reminder that we ask parents and families not to park in Marazion School car park or on School Lane at drop off and pick up times, including for Breakfast Club drop off. This makes sure that there are no traffic problems, and the road/school car park is not dangerous, so children and adults remain safe at these times. Parking on School Lane is only for exceptional circumstances – these circumstances do not include bad weather or if you are running late. A reminder also that parents can park at Marazion Community Centre at drop off and pick up times – car passes are available from the School Office. Staff on gate duty will be reminding people about parking at the start and the end of the school day. Many thanks for your support to keep School Lane and access to school safe for everyone.

#### Marazion School Academy Conversion

We wanted to let you know that the Department for Education (DfE) Regional Director has approved the academy conversion of Marazion School to join Crofty Education Trust (CET). We have also recently received an Academy Order from the DfE, which enables the school to convert to an academy. Marazion School is now working with the DfE, CET and Penwith Education Trust regarding 'onboarding' - the process of becoming an academy.
